Present the **2010 YOUTH WILDLIFE ART CONTEST** **ENTRY INFORMATION**

ELIGIBILITY

- The Youth Wildlife Art Contest is open to children in grades 5, 6, and 7 attending a school including home school in southern Illinois.
- Only one entry per child will be accepted.

HOW TO ENTER

Entries must include:

- ❑ Artwork of participant's assigned wildlife species
 - 5th Grade: Salamander
 - 6th Grade: Coyote
 - 7th Grade: Great Horned Owl
- ❑ A complete entry form that is signed and affixed to the back of the original artwork

ENTRY DEADLINE: Postmark or hand-deliver by ***Thursday, September 16, 2010***

REQUIREMENTS

- The artwork must call attention to the animal in its typical southern Illinois habitat.
- All artwork must be the contestant's original, hand-made creation.
- **All artwork must be 9" X 12" and horizontal without a mat, frame, cover sheet, or border.**
- All artwork must not exceed ¼ inch in total thickness.
- Art techniques may include drawing, painting, collage, or linoleum printing. Materials may include crayon, graphite, colored pencil, chalk, charcoal, watercolor, acrylic, or tempera. (Please note: If contestants use chalk or charcoal they should spray the artwork with a sealant.)

RESTRICTIONS

- Photographs and computer-generated artwork will not be accepted.
- **No signatures or initials may appear on the front of the artwork.** Any artwork with such identifying characteristics will be disqualified and eliminated from the competition.
- Students may gain inspiration from photographs of wildlife and related habitat, but they must not copy photographs or other images directly. **Their work must be completely original.**

PRIZES

- Final judging notification will be emailed or faxed to teachers. The top ten finalists in each of the three categories will have their artwork displayed in the John A. Logan College Conference Center.
- Finalists, their families and friends, and their teachers will be invited to the Youth Wildlife Art Contest awards ceremony at John A. Logan College. This is a free event. The awards ceremony will take place during Hunting & Fishing Days so that families may stay and enjoy many other activities.
- All finalists will receive a certificate of participation at the awards ceremony.
- One overall winner for each grade will be announced at the awards ceremony.
- Each overall winner will receive \$50 cash.

John A. Logan College and the Youth Outdoor Education Foundation:

- Have the right to use the name of the contestant without compensation.
- May retain all winning entries until November 1st of this year and return the winning entries to students or their schools in November.
- Will not insure entered artwork or be responsible for loss or damage of the entries.
- May photograph or scan any entered artwork for publicity purposes.
- May show entered artwork on their respective websites.
- May remove any artwork from the exhibit.
